Admission Requirements

BSN completion students are awarded up to 71 credit hours upon acceptance into the program in recognition of previous education coursework required for licensure.

Applicants must provide the following to be considered for admission:

- Proof of unrestricted RN license from a state board of nursing.
- Minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale
