**Trinity Health Foundation**  
**MOBURG EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP/GRANT PROGRAM**

*Established in 1986 in Honor of Kenneth D. Moburg*

Created for the benefit of sons and daughters of current employees with five or more consecutive years of employment with Trinity Regional Health System

The purpose of the educational grant is to provide monetary assistance to an employee's child who is pursuing a degree in a health care profession that requires an undergraduate degree or more (ex. physician, dentist, registered pharmacist, registered physical therapist, bachelor's or master's level nursing, dietitian, or social worker).

No grant is to exceed \$2,000 to any one applicant. All grants are one time annual awards.

All grants shall be made in the form of a loan secured by a promissory note. When the intended course of education is completed with evidence of such completion submitted to Trinity Health Foundation, the note shall be canceled with no payment required.

The Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of Trinity Health Foundation or a committee of three members of the foundation's board appointed by the board chair, shall review the applications and per the provisions as stipulated below, select the grant recipients.

Notice of the availability of the Moburg Educational Grant shall be communicated to employees via Trinity's internal communication system

Applications must be submitted to the President of Trinity Health Foundation no later than June 17, 2012. The scholarship shall be awarded no later than the 2<sup>nd</sup> week in July

In addition to the requirement that the applicant be the child of an employee who has been employed with Trinity Regional Health System or its predecessor institutions for at least five consecutive years, the applicant must:

- have completed his/her freshman year in an accredited college or university
- have a "B" average or above i.e. a 3 point grade average on a 4 point scale
- have a declared major in a healthcare field of study with the intent to pursue a degree in that field of study

Applicants with demonstrated financial need will be given preference over those without compelling need although an applicant need not have financial need to be considered for a grant.

Previous grant recipients are ineligible for future grants.
