Calculate by starting with number of RN's who enroll in their first nursing course (and not drop/withdraw from course during the 1st two weeks of their first course) during one academic year ie 2006-2007. Count "Fall-Spring-Summer" as one year. Do not count ASN students who "work ahead" in the BSN program by permission. Count only students fully matriculated into the BSN program. Count students only once. This constitutes the denominator of the fraction. Count the number of graduates during the subsequent third year, ie 2008-2009 as this is the typical time completion for most students. This is the numerator of the graduation rate fraction. Because many BSN-C's take longer than the three years, there is "catchup" on the rate that shows greater than 100%.
