



Financial Aid Disbursements

The Financial Aid Office on behalf of Trinity College of Nursing & Health Sciences reserves the right to review, adjust, or cancel an award at any time due to changes in the recipient's financial, academic, or enrollment status, or because the recipient does not maintain satisfactory academic progress toward current degree program.

Please be aware:

- Financial aid amounts offered from federal and state agencies are dependent upon legislative allocation of funds and are subject to change at the discretion of the disbursing agency.
- Financial aid from all outside sources must be reported to the Financial Aid Office.
- Financial aid is intended to be used towards the cost of education.
- Financial Aid is finalized and disbursements to individual student accounts will begin after the drop/add period of the corresponding semester. At no time will any portion of the award be disbursed prior to classes starting.
- Students who are borrowing from the Federal Direct Loan Programs for the first time are required to complete Loan Entrance Counseling and a Master Promissory Note online. Loan disbursements will not be made until this has been completed.
- Financial Aid disbursements are contingent upon successful satisfactory academic progress (SAP) and a student's active enrollment status of half-time or more (6+ credit hours per semester).

Satisfactory Academic Progress Regulations

Trinity College of Nursing & Health Sciences requires financial aid recipients to maintain satisfactory academic progress.

- Students receiving financial aid are expected to maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher in all courses.
- Students must complete 67% of all attempted courses per year.
- Students must complete the academic program for which they are currently enrolled within 150% of the published program completion timeframe.

Each student's academic performance is reviewed at the end of each semester. Individuals who are not meeting the minimum requirements will be placed on financial aid probation for the subsequent semester. They will have one semester to improve their academic standing at the College or financial aid will be revoked.

Reinstatement of financial aid is automatic by achieving satisfactory academic progress.

Students' financial aid will be terminated without the possibility for reinstatement when exceeding 150% of the published program completion timeframe.
