ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

To meet the minimum Military/Reservist, the applicant will be required to have:

- Served in select military classifications: Army medics, Navy hospital corpsmen, Air Force flight medics, and other military medical specialists regardless of branch of service.
- Been discharged in the last two (2) years or within five (5) years for those who have been employed in a civilian health care role.
- Two years of experience in a military medical specialist role or civilian equivalent
- Minimum GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Completion of all required prerequisite general education courses with a "C" (2.0) or above
 - Anatomy and Physiology I with lab-4 credits
 - Anatomy and Physiology II with lab-4 credits
 - Human Growth and Development-3 credits
 - o Medical Terminology-2 or 3 credits
 - Microbiology with lab-4 credits
 - Nutrition-3 credits
 - o Statistics-3 credits

Applicants who do not hold a bachelor's degree prior to beginning the nursing program must also complete the following courses prior to the first semester of the program:

- o Anthropology-3 credits
- o College Algebra-3 credits
- o English Composition I-3 credits
- o English Composition II-3 credits
- Ethics-3 credits
- Humanities-3 credits
- Oral Communication-3 credits
- Psychology-3 credits
- Sociology-3 credits
