PREREQUISITE COURSES

Trinity College maintains cooperative agreements with Black Hawk College, Eastern Iowa Community Colleges, and Portage Learning, which provide general education courses required for the MSN degree. Academic credit from other regionally or nationally accredited institutions will be considered upon review. During the pre-application process, admission representatives offer unofficial evaluations of prerequisite coursework for prospective applicants. Upon submission of the application, the Registrar will evaluate the student's transcript to formally approve the prerequisite courses.
